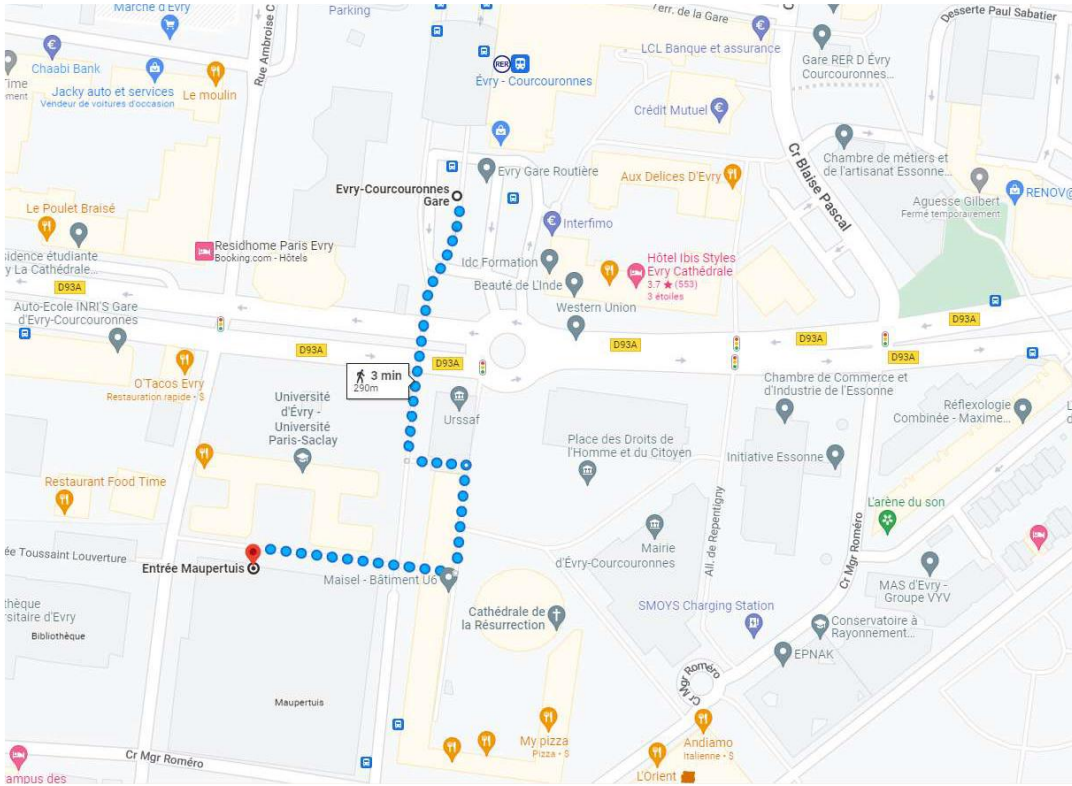

**Access: RER D: RER D towards Corbeil-Essonne, stop at Evry-Courcouronnes station**

**Directions: Take RER D in Paris towards Corbeil-Essonne and get down at Evry-Courcouronnes station (around 40 minutes from Gare de Lyon in Paris). In Evry, the university is only 300 meters away (see map). Directions from the Evry station: 1. Head south 2. Turn left toward Le Clos de la Cathédrale 3. Turn right onto Le Clos de la Cathédrale**

**Access: Metro: Odéon (4 and 10), St Michel (4), Cluny Sorbonne (10) // RER B or C: Saint Michel – Notre Dame**

*How to get from the conference venue to the restaurant Bouillon Racine, 3 Rue Racine, 75006 Paris, France:*

Take RER D from Evry-Courcouronnes Station to Paris (either Orly-la-Ville - Coye or Villiers-le-Bel - Gonesse - Arnouville directions are fine). Change at Chatelet for the RER B direction South (Sud) for only one station (either Robinson, Massy-Palaisau or Saint-Remy Chevreuses directions are fine). Stop at Saint-Michel Notre Dame
